Love Beyond Our Shores

What a fantastic day we had a Trinity on Sunday 8th May. It was a day of celebration as we gave thanks for the renovation of our church building.

We also celebrated the work of the Mami Martin Fund and our Love Beyond Our Shores Initiative. Through the Fund, the circuit is funding six girls for four years to enable them to attend secondary school. Our girls have just finished their first term.

Moira Dunworth one of the trustees, came down from Scotland to talk about the work of the Fund and our part in the education of these girls.

There was a photographic exhibition , videos and a talk.

We picked Moira up from Wigan Station on the Saturday and spent the afternoon, mounting the photos on screens etc.

The following morning we rushed home after church for lunch before heading back later than planned, for an afternoon session with a buffet tea. As we got to church there was a

queue waiting to get in! It was all hands on deck. Some of the photos had slipped, some captions had fallen off!

Whilst my car did not touch tarmac, as I sped off to pick up Pauline, Moira set about with the help of the three "youngsters" as she called them to repair the exhibition and to take photographs of people attending.



As people helped themselves to refreshments, Moira realised it was a good idea to have a run through of her talk and video for the evening service.

Everything went off without a hitch and the buzz in the air was exhilarating.

As people departed, lots of cards etc were sold and donations given, with new people asking how to donate

As people started to arrive for the 6.30 service led by the Rev. Michael. We served tea, coffee and cake again. Everybody then settled down for the service and Moira did a presentation on the work of MMF, videos were shown and we saw a photo of the six Lancashire West girls.

A video of Mercy Sibande, the only paid worker that the fund has, talked about our girls and told us the story of one of them. The video was complete with the interruption of a little boy (Mercy's son) smiling into the bottom of some of the video, and giggling!!

Moira was delighted to inform us that our fundraising was great and that the first year target had been met and we were well on our way to the second years funding.

No surprise for us in the circuit!..

The moderator of URC attended (Trinity had received funding from the URC for new audiovisual equipment). He was much impressed with the renovations and the community groups that were meeting at Trinity.

Michael ended the service with thanksgiving and prayers for the MMF board, who are all volunteers, and prayers for Mercy, St Mary's School and our six girls.

The congregation were then free to look at our renovations, talk to Moira etc. followed by more Coffee and cake if wanted. A proper Methodist event! And of course donate and buy gift cards etc.

We saw Moira off at Wigan station the following

day, tired but delighted with the way she had been welcomed and by the enthusiasm and love shown to her and the support that LBOS is giving the the Fund.

Circuit Steward Vacancies

The Circuit Stewards are looking for 2 new colleagues to be part of their team and the Circuit Leadership Team (CLT) with particular responsibilities for either Finance or Circuit Property.

For both roles, during the first 12 months, the steward will shadow and share responsibility with those already in the post and there will be assistance provided by the office.

The daily finance activities will be managed by circuit office staff who will also be liaising with church treasurers and property Stewards.

Finance Treasurer—Responsible for

- 1) the efficient management of the Circuit's finances
- 2) maintenance of the Circuit's bank accounts and accounting records, and the payment of expenses and collection of income. (this is largely carried out by the Circuit administrator)
- 3) preparation, and monitoring, of annual budgets, and reporting as necessary to the CLT.
- 4) preparation of Annual Accounts and associated schedules for Publication to Circuit meeting , District finance committee, and the Charity Commission.

Detailed Activities

<u>Bookkeeping</u> -payment of Circuit expenses, and collection of income (assessments)-checking and reconciling the bank statements-maintenance of accounting records (cash book/Excel schedules) (this is largely carried out by the Circuit administrator).

<u>Budgeting</u> -preparation of suggested Assessments on Churches for the year, and discussion with CLT, and the Church treasurers.-preparation of annual budget of income and expenditure, and submission to CLT and the Circuit Meeting.-monitoring actual income and expenditure against budget, and drawing attention to significant deviations therefrom.

<u>Reporting</u> -preparation of regular "management accounts" during the year for CLT.-preparation of the Annual Accounts for the year ended 31 August, and submission to CLT, and Circuit Meeting with suitable commentary.

the Accounts should be in two formats:

- -the Methodist Standard Form of Accounts ('SFA') -a summarised view of the year
- -a detailed Receipts and Payments Account, showing the detail of transactions on all of the funds held by the Circuit (General, Manses, Removals, and Model Trust Fund)
- -arrange for the accounts to be independently examined in accordance with the Charity Accounting regulations.
- -preparation of the Trustees Annual Report, and submission to Charity Commission along with the Annual Accounts and Annual Return.

- -<u>submission of the following documents to the District</u> finance committee:
- -Annual Standard Form Accounts
- -Reserves Policy statement
- -Circuit and Church cash and investments form.

Other Matters

-receive the accounts of all churches in the Circuit, (by end December) and review them to ensure compliance with accounting regulations, and the correct use of Reserves.

Meetings

-should normally attend the following regular meetings:

CLT (8-10 per year)

Circuit (2-3 per year)

All Circuit treasurers with District Treasurer (end January annually)




