Dear friends.

As we count down the last few days to Christmas, we are very much in Nativity Season, as we hear and share the familiar story in so many varied and innovative ways. It's amazing just how many different permutations there can be of one basic story. So many ways of telling of how the Good News of God's love was shown to the World.

At the end of November, I reprised my role as a Shepherd as Burscough hosted six Schools who came along to Meet the Characters of the Nativity — as part of The Hope Journey, and I know that Up Holland put on a similar event. Whilst not being entirely taken in by the costumes and acting ["are you going to be a Shepherd again and use your mobile phone for the sheep noises" — a Y2 Holmeswood girl on her second visit], the children were very excited about what they experienced and are still talking about it several weeks later.

Many of the children who visited us will be taking part in their own School Nativities over the next few days, providing memories for their families and anecdotes of things that may not have gone exactly to plan or things misunderstood. Once more at the heart of these depictions of the Nativity there is a demonstration of the love of God.

Dai Wooldridge, a writer and performer who works for the Bible Society, who, through the past few Christmas's, has produced thought provoking readings and dramas around the events of the Nativity. This year, he has produced a Story aimed at the younger members of our families, "Festive Fred finds the greatest gift"; with an accompanying video of Dai reading the story which you can find by following the link or looking at the Bible Society webpage



Call for Advent candle to remain unlit for peace

To remember all those who have died in the Israel/Palestine conflict, Methodist churches across the country are being called upon to leave their second Advent candle unlit this year.

The call not to light the candle, which represents peace, on the second Sunday in Advent (10 December) and on subsequent Sundays, follows the news that celebrations to mark Christmas in the Holy Land will be subdued this year.

The Revd David Hardman, Methodist Liaison Officer, Jerusalem, is currently fulfilling his role from the UK and remains in touch with those living in the Middle East. David explained, "Our Christian colleagues in Bethlehem tell us that this Advent and Christmas the lights that normally adorn the birth place of Jesus will remain unlit in memory of those who have been killed in the current conflict. We are inviting Methodist churches in Britain to leave the second candle of Advent unlit to serve as a reminder that we stand in solidarity with all who are suffering in the Holy Land."

The President of the Methodist Conference, the Revd Gill Newton, commented, "The events of over 2000 years ago and of now, remind us that sadly, nothing much has changed. We are still caught up in conflict and challenge, fear and uncertainty. This Advent, to stand with Palestinian Christians, we invite Methodist Churches to leave the Advent candle on the Second Sunday unlit and for it to remain unlit throughout advent."

"God is still present even in the most difficult places, and in the midst of violent conflict so many people are wishing for and seeking peace!"

Churches who participate are invited to take a photo of their Advent Ring on Christmas Day with the second candle unlit to be shared with local church communities in the Holy Land.

The Neighbourhood Project in Four Parts







In Spring 2022, as part of the **Neighbourhood Project Initiative**, I got together with the One Programme Leader for Up Holland, Becky and we decided to run a craft group for Women on a Friday afternoon. We based our work around the making of a Peace Banner: the war in Ukraine had just begun. Over the weeks, we wove, we sewed, we made "feathers", but most importantly we shared fellowship and prayers. We were small in number at the **Reclaim Café**, as we called ourselves, but that didn't matter. Eventually, we had made a beautiful banner, which now greets people on their way into **Up Holland Methodist Church**.



Out of this work, we formed links with the Missional Priest at St Thomas the Martyr in Up Holland, the Reverend Jack Shepherd and discussed what we could do next as part of the Up Holland Community Hub. He introduced us to his Mum, who led an initiative called Peaced Together over in Yorkshire.

Peaced Together is a world-wide organisation founded over 10 years ago by Heidi Singleton. It began as a project for Women, but there are now courses for Men and Young Children. During the course of 10 weeks, five crafts are completed which, as the initiative explains helps to bring about healing.

"Brokenness is an opportunity for creative design" By exploring mosaic, decoupage, quilting, weaving and painting, we will show you how the creative arts can ignite a hope in you that your life can also be pieced together.

It seemed like this was what we should do next. So, after Reverend Jack gained funding for the project from West Lancashire Community Champions, two of us duly attended the training course over 6 weeks via Zoom; gathered the resources; advertised and began a course in September 2022.

From the beginning, the group were able to share thoughts and feelings based around that week's topic and craft and friend-ships began to be formed. It was a privilege to lead these sessions with my colleague and our group of volunteers, who helped to make teas and coffees, shared their sewing expertise and also joined in the discussions. We were also blessed with the presence of Reverend Alex Laing, the Methodist Minister, who gave pastoral support and continues to do so whenever possible.

At the end of the 10 weeks, we had a celebration "Jacob's Join" and invited friends to come and see the crafts that had been made. It was a wonderful afternoon, which Reverend Jack came to with his wife, Emily. But what next the participants all asked?







Part Two - Hearts and Hands

Well, we decided to start a supportive Whatsapp group and continued to meet for another five weeks, whilst the group made decisions. It was then that "Hearts and Hands" developed. This is a group open to anyone who was part of the original course, as well as others. It met on Monday afternoons, but moved to another part of the Up Holland Parish/Lancashire West Methodist District at Christ the Servant, Digmoor, as part of our ecumenical work in this area. The group continued to meet until the summer months and then has had a rest.



Part Three - Peaced Together 2

The next Peaced Together group began in February 2023. It was based in Christ the Servant Church in Digmoor, Skelmersdale, as there were some young mum's who were keen to join, but couldn't travel to the original setting. Once again, the ladies were are able to share with each other in a supportive environment.

Part Four - Peaced Together 3

After a summer break, a new group met once again at Up Holland. Some of the ladies were new to the course, whilst one returned as a volunteer and two ladies came for the fellowship and crafts. Over the summer, one of our original participants trained to lead the group. Indeed, in January she will be helping to lead the next group which will take place at Trinity Methodist/URC on Monday afternoons, as we extend the reach to another part of the Up Holland/Skelmersdale Hub.

At the start of December, 17 of us went for a Christmas meal to Bramleys in Ormskirk. It was good to see participants from the different groups getting to know each other. We intend to continue with these lunch meetings once a quarter, and are also working on reviving the Hearts and Hands group.

We are grateful for the support of Reverend Alex, Reverend Paul Lock from St Thomas the Martyr in Up Holland and The Hub community of Up Holland, as well as the churches that have and continue to support us.

Missional thoughts

If you have been thinking about how you can reach out to others in your community, sharing God's love, whilst also helping to bring about positive thoughts, then I would highly recommend investigating about how to start a Peaced Together group. Peaced Together came out of a place of brokenness, which has Christian values and ministry at its core. The training, guides you through not only practical things, but also spiritual and safe-guarding issues. Its proven successful structure and support network means that as you work with people; you know that you are not alone.



If you had asked me at the start of January 2022 about how I was helping with missional work in my area, then I couldn't have forseen where the Lord was guiding me. In one of the sessions, we read the poem by **Corrie Ten Boom called Tapestry of Life**, it begins with this verse.

My Life is but a weaving

Between the Lord and me;

I cannot choose the colours

He worketh steadily.

May you find the weaving that God has intended for you.


